

OCSH Urges the City of Ottawa to Follow Toronto's Lead and Ban Hookah Smoking Inside Public Places and Workplaces

Ottawa (November 5, 2015) - The Ottawa Council on Smoking or Health (OCSH) congratulates the City of Toronto for banning hookah smoking inside city-licensed businesses¹ and urges the City of Ottawa to follow Toronto's lead without delay.

"The City of Ottawa took a small step by banning hookah smoking on outdoor municipal property in 2012², but more needs to be done to prevent youth from becoming addicted to hookah products and to protect hospitality workers," says Carol McDonald, president of the OCSH. "There are no legal or scientific reasons preventing Ottawa from including hookah smoking in the indoor smoke-free bylaws."

Approximately 14% of Canadian youth between grades 9-12 have tried hookah smoking.³ A recent scientific study found that "Staff and patrons of waterpipe cafes are exposed to air quality levels considered hazardous to human health. Results support eliminating waterpipe smoking in hospitality venues indoors and out."⁴

British Columbia, Alberta, Nova Scotia, New Brunswick, and Québec have adopted provincial bans. Other municipalities across Ontario, including Barrie, Peterborough, and Orillia, have also adopted bans.
